### A Message from the Board Chairman

Community Services Foundation (CSF) is honored to introduce the 16th Annual Make A Match Campaign, which will take place from November 1, 2018 to December 31, 2018. Each year, our matching program brings increased donations and we hope our 2018 Campaign will be our most impactful yet.

This year, I am, again, proud to announce that CSF will match every contribution made to CTF ILLINOIS (CTF) dollar for dollar, up to \$1,000.00 for individual donations and up to \$500.00 for corporate donations. If you give \$100.00, CSF will match your contribution, adding \$100.00, resulting in a \$200.00 donation to CTF. ## A Message from the Executive Director

Since its incorporation in 2013, LifeStyles Academy (LSA) has supported young adults with intellectual disabilities. After leaving high school, many adolescents with disabilities are left without the programs and services they need to transition effectively to adulthood, as state budget cuts continue to result in program cuts and long waiting lists. LSA was established in response to this glaring unmet need. For the past five years, LSA has provided outstanding, well-rounded community day programming to more than 30 individuals, including some who have received state funding.

However, the Foundation recognizes that, like many small organizations, LSA needs additional financial and business support in order to best fulfill its mission. Thus, on July 1, 2018, LSA formally merged with CTF ILLINOIS (CTF). By becoming an official program of CTF, LSA will benefit from CTF's many resources while maintaining their own programming, mission, and location. LSA participants have gained access to CTF's successful employment services program and efficient transportation system, while LSA staff has undergone professional development training with CTF's dedicated staff members.

Already, everyone at CTF is impressed with LSA's welcoming atmosphere and robust support of families and I can't agree more. On behalf of both CSF and CTF, I extend a huge welcome to LSA!



### Next Steps

During the next fiscal year, CSF and CTF leadership will focus on strengthening LSA's community day services even further. We will strive to provide each participant with person-centered support, a personalized program tailored to their specific developmental needs and goals as well as increased opportunities for community involvement.

We are currently making many exciting enhancements to LSA's programming and we can't wait to share all of our hard work in next spring's newsletter. As we make these transitions, we hope that you support us in our mission. We are confident that, as a program of CTF, LSA will be in the best position possible to help young adults with disabilities forge fulfilling futures.

# CSF Awards New Grants to CTF ILLINOIS



Every year, Community Services Foundation (CSF) provides funding through grants administered to CTF ILLINOIS (CTF), allowing the staff of CTF to dedicate more time and resources to direct supports for people with disabilities. This fiscal year, CSF was pleased to award CTF with three new grants to be used for staff development, improved operational systems, and the expansion of arts programming. Below is an overview of the grants recently awarded to CTF:

We have devoted one grant to staff development. With these funds, Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) employed at CTF will participate in full-day trainings centered on how to better support people with disabilities. It is our hope that the training will give staff additional resources and confidence they need to work with those we support every day. Be on the lookout for updates to these trainings in our Spring newsletter!

The improved operational systems grant will be used to install an efficient MITC biometric timekeeping system in every training location and residential home. This will reduce the time and expense of record-keeping and payroll, thus increasing CTF's operational efficiency. Lastly, the arts program grant will be used to establish a new arts curriculum featuring fine arts, dance, music, and drama courses. We believe that the arts provide a means of self-expression, emotional management, and relaxation for people with disabilities, and we are thrilled to expand this initiative.

We are honored to support CTF in their mission to serve people with disabilities and hope that these grants will result in even greater outcomes for the people we support.
